NOTICE PURSUANT TO SECTION 152AW(6) OF THE TRADE PRACTICES ACT 1974 (CTH)


On 19 November 2008 applications were made to the Australian Competition Tribunal (the Tribunal) to review the decisions of the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) under section 152AT of the *Trade Practices Act 1974 (Cth)* (the Act) to grant exemption orders to Telstra Corporation Limited (Telstra) from its standard access obligations under section 152AR of the Act. The standard access obligations relate to the supply by Telstra of the public switched telephone network originating access (PSTN OA) service. Section 152AW(5) of the Act requires the Tribunal to make its decision within six months after receiving an application for review (the statutory six month period).

The statutory six month period for each application ends on 20 May 2009. The Tribunal is unable to make its decisions within that period. The reason is as follows. In addition to the applications in relation to PSTN OA Telstra made four applications for exemption orders in relation to the wholesale line rental service and the local carriage service (individual exemption orders 1 – 4 of 2008) (the WLR/LCS applications). The PSTNA OA applications were heard by the Tribunal between 20 April 2009 and 22 April 2009. The issues that arise in those applications are similar to the issues that arise in the WLR/LCS applications. It was suggested by the parties, and accepted by the Tribunal, that it was preferable for the Tribunal to hear and determine the WLR/LCS applications before it determined the PSTN OA applications.

The Tribunal's decisions on the WLR/LCS applications are due to be handed down by 13 June 2009. The Tribunal will deliver its decisions on the PSTN OA applications after it determines the WLR/LCS applications.

Pursuant to section 152AW(6) of the Act, the Tribunal hereby extends the statutory six month period for each application by three months to end on 20 August 2009.
